Jaxson Ashley, Senor Project Officer at Men's Sheds WA, made his first visit to Waterwheel Community Shed. He joined us for morning tea (above) and then gave a presentation on MSWA. There are around 7,000 shedders in over 180 sheds in WA. Jaxson gave us a run down on what MSWA does and the benefits for members of belonging to their local shed.

Jaxson also gave us a rundown of the findings from the Thriving Shed Project that MSWA had been jointly involved in with Curtin University. The main conclusion was that Men's Sheds are a practical and effective resource for promoting wellbeing in older men.
